Roadside inspections are a big part of reducing truck related deaths. So make sure that you and your equipment are ready for this 72-hour roadside inspection and law enforcement blitz.

SURVIVAL TIPS

- Ensure that your vehicle is in tip-top shape, wear your seat belt, don't speed, don't drive fatigued, and put your cell phone down when behind the wheel.
- Be aware that the most common violation areas are: brakes out of adjustment, other brake problems, lights, tires and wheels, cargo load securement
- Be professional and courteous
- Check tires carefully as bad tires and sidewall damage are an invitation for a thorough inspection
- Have your CDL & medical card (including any waivers)
- Keep your log book current (up-to-date to the last duty status) and neat, and that you have the last 7 days
- Make sure you have your annual inspection for truck and registration for trailer and that all documents in permit book are updated
- Keep in mind that all inspection violations will become part of your CSA/SMS record
- Ask for a sticker if you get a level one roadside inspection



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
